

Dear Tablers.

Firstly I wish you & your loved ones a wonderful season & New Year blessed with happiness and prosperity! Just where the time flies I don't know? But I look back at a very eventful year of Tabling and would like to express my

sincere gratitude to those Tablers who have gone above and beyond the call of duty to enrich our lives with incredible fun and fulfillment as well as touched the lives of communities in need. A thousand thank you's.

I was in Nepal in Nov for the quarterly RTI Board meeting and pleasantly surprised by what our brothers there at RT Nepal have achieved. Nepal is a country a bit more than twice the size of Sri Lanka but with around 27 million people, only 28% more people. I was astounded to find they have 23 Tables with 300+Tablers! Compare this with the 6 tables and 80 Tablers that Sri Lanka has. RT Nepal was chartered in 1999 and RT Sri Lanka only four years later.

Whilst I inquired and deliberated on the many reasons for this impressive growth, one thing really stood out... how well RT Nepal was STRUCTURED. And by this I don't simply mean the people but the processes they have adopted to grow the RT organization and make it one of the most sought after social clubs in the country. They currently have a waiting list of tablers, and even some Tables that were inaugurated but now waiting to be chartered!

Some initiatives that stand out are:

- How well they handle their Meeting Agendas... impeccably planned & delicately balanced between fun and serious business.
- How well rehearsed their Sargent At Arms always is... ensuring that their fines are multifaceted by encouraging

- conformity whilst capturing the humour in every given situation.
- The fantastic branding: on their vehicles, at the venues of their events & on themselves! Everyone is abundantly aware of a Round Table function as the brand is really made to stand out in a BIG way.

FREE MEDICAL CAMP HOSTED BY EQUATOR ROUND TABLE NO. 28



On the 6th of December 2015, the Tablers of Equator Round Table conducted a free medical camp that benefited nearly 500 needy people. The medical camp ran from 9.00am to 5.00pm and had over 20 doctors, 6 clinical officers and 10 nurses. Some of the doctors were GP's Oncologists, ENT Specialists, Orthopaedics, Paediatricians, Nutritionist's and Physiotherapists.

The medical camp was held at the Jalaram Academy Grounds and the most of the volunteers were the school children and school staff who did a wonderful job in making sure the camp flowed smoothly.

Many patients were found for the first time that they suffered from high blood pressure and some never knew that they had diabetes. Medicines were prescribed to each of the 500 patients and they were all dispensed completely FREE of charge.

The platinum sponsors were Standard Chartered Bank, whilst the silver sponsors were Nakumatt and Tembo Energy Drink. The bronze sponsorship category was covered by the Sindha Family and the Bhayani Family Trust. Individual Round Tabler sponsors were Jiten Pabari and Vishaal Shah who kick started the project. The pharmaceutical sponsors included Regal Pharmaceuticals, Cosmos Limited, Universal Corporation, Kentons Limited, Laboratory & Allied and Crown Healthcare.

The project Convenor Mital Shah and his team took on this mammoth project and very successfully completed it. His team included Jay Shah, Vishaal Shah, Keval Shah, Kushal Patel, Amit Kotecha, Harsheel Kaneria. Dr Rajan of the NCCK also helped the Tablers to understand the mechanics of a free medical camp. On the day all the tablers worked extremely hard to make sure the event was a huge success.

Equator Round Table 28 falls under the direct governance of Round Tables in Easter Africa and has kept the flag flying high for over 27 years making sure the social service is delivered to the point.



THE 35TH BAHRAIN MARATHON RELAY

organised by the Bahrain Round Table, took place at the Bahrain International Circuit (BIC) on the 27th November 2015, on the weekend of the RTAG Half Yearly.

The day attracted the joint highest number of participants, with 177 teams competing. Each team completed 16 legs on road around the BIC track and through the desert. The event this year is expected to have raised close to BD 30,000 (Bahrain Dinar) for charity.

Over the past 35 years the event has raised in excess of BD

1,000,000 (\$2.7m) and it is one of the largest and most successful charity events in the Kingdom of Bahrain. All funds raised are donated towards Bahrain based charitable causes, which have previously included other not-for-profit organisations providing services such as education, food relief, shelter, special need support and animal rescue and rehabilitation.

Today however we are lucky enough to have elite professional players for a tennis tournament here in Bressuire. We had to make this most of this opportunity. This event will help these children to enjoy a day away from their everyday lives and problems, to help them discover another world. » explained the Chairman.

Around 10 children aged between 8 and 13 years old were present to experience a day of learning and fun, linked to sport. They were joined by students from Notre Dame college who volunteered to help join the two worlds together.

After a first experience of tennis in the morning, the children had the chance to meet the professional tennis players who were kind enough to halt their preparations for the tournament to make time for photos with the children and to sign autographs. The day continued with the children watching these same players competing on court.

MARCO PIERRE WHITE ARRIVES IN SRI LANKA

He's the enfant terrible of the culinary world, the visionary who redefined modern British cuisine, and the man who infamously returned three Michelin stars to reinvent himself. When Marco Pierre White arrives in Sri Lanka next January, he will set a precedent as one of the first Michelin starred celebrity chefs to visit the island. He has trained chefs such as Gordon Ramsay, Curtis Stone and Shannon Bennet.

Colombo Paradise Round Table 5 (CPRT5), which was the 5th Table Chartered in Sri Lanka was formed in 2013. The Members, under the leadership of Chairman Tr. Asif Nanji immediately engaged themselves in ambitious Community Service Projects that saw the Renovation of a Home for The Elders in Borella; and the building of a Vocational Activities Centre for 'The Refuge' Home For Abused Girls in Kandy. CPRT 5 through a Fund Raiser held at the Blue Elephant, Hilton Colombo raised the funds needed for the construction of the Vocational Activities Centre, which was completed and handed over in 2014.

The next Community Service Project undertaken by CPRT 5 was to raise funds for the 'The Ceylon School for the Deaf & Blind, Ratmalana'. Funds were raised in November 2014 through a Fund Raiser held at the CASA Colombo, a Premier boutique hotel in Sri Lanka. The Project saw much needed equipment such as fans for the children's dormitories, facilities maintenance equipment, special audio visual equipment and other necessities donated to the School in March this year.

CPRT 5's Charity Fundraisers have always been the most anticipated Events in the Sri Lankan Tabling calendar, and this year we have taken things to a different level! In 2016 under the Chairmanship of Tr. Hazim Abdul Cader, The Table is having a Charity Fundraiser with an International Celebrity Chef – the renowned Marco Pierre White. Colombo Paradise Round Table 5 has 50 VIP tickets priced at LKR 30,000/- (approx. US\$ 200) to meet the culinary great for exclusive cocktails and dinner.

CLEAN-UP OF A MANGROVE FOREST BY THE MAURITIUS RT 1

A very large mangrove forest in Mahebourg, south-east of Mauritius, is nest to fish larve, crabs and other small shellfish. These mangroves are within an ancient fish farm, and although its structures still exist, the farm is no longer used. For many years, household waste thrown into coastal rivers upstream travel through the lagoon and end up into this mangrove forest, and remain there. Moreover, some inhabitants of the region throw their waste directly into the mangroves.

The Mauritius Round Table One organized, sponsored and participated in a clean-up of this forest on Sunday the 29th of November. Within three hours, the 40 volunteers (other NGO's and inhabitants joined the Round Table) removed 1970 kg, or near two tons, of waste: mostly plastics, used syringes, textiles, cardboard, tiles and other construction waste, car wheels, fridges, mattresses and glass bottles. Articles have been published in the newspapers to call for attention from the government as well as a mean to make the public aware of this dramatic ecological problem.

Its been a hectic month with travel to NTM in Iceland, the RTI Board Meeting and

inspection of the World Meeting Facilities in Nepal, followed by the AGM of Israel. Kaj wrote about NTM in his last article so I would like to touch on the highlights of Nepal and Israel.

Extensions in RT Nepal

RT Nepal inaugurated 4 clubs on our visit to Nepal. They added more than 40 members over 2 days, that is more than a $10\,\%$ growth in membership. Why was this possible and what can we learn from them. I identified 4 key points:

1. There must be a plan to grow and it must be done in a very practical manner.

- RT Nepal are very organized with their extensions clear timing, guidelines, extension packs, certificates etc to all new members. By doing this their members have real context in which to be tablers.
- RT Nepal have identified the need to be diverse, that is they
 understand their tables must be a reflection of the different
 cultures and ethnicities in their population. This also helps
 sustainability and growth.
- 4. All fellowship events and charity projects they do, also have the aim of generating membership.

World Meeting – RT Nepal Sept 2016

The world meeting organizing team, led by convener Manoj Kumar Das are ready and well organized. The event will be unique, Nepal is a great place, with a unique culture and the beauty of the Himalays range. In Nepal it is said that "Visitor is god" so you are sure to get great hospitality and welcome.

Update on ALL4Nepal

Due to political issues, borders into Nepal have been closed and key items such as fuel and other consumables are not getting through. Fuel prices have risen 4 times the normal price, increasing the price of all construction related material. This has caused a delay in the projects currently underway. It was decided to wait till mid December, in the hope that Political issues will clear up. In the event they did not, it was agreed that the school building would continue, even though there would be an increase in costs .

RT Nepal have committed to completing the current class rooms and schools under construction by Aug 2016. At the same time they will identifying, with the ministry of education, other school that need renovation or rebuilding. The entire ALL4 Nepal project









is to be completed by end Aug 2017.

RTI Board Meeting

From the topics discussed at the RTI board meeting the need to re-structure RTI was a key new idea. We believe that the current structure has been tried and tested. Its results have been mixed. We are not meeting our goals of becoming younger and bigger. So the question remains how do we achieve our targets.

The RTI board has begun a thinking process of how to re-structure RTI to achieve our objectives. We will bring our ideas and thinking to the $\frac{1}{2}$ year meeting to share with the floor, where it can be debated and developed further. Here are a few things to think about:

- 1. RTI regions in particular where are membership is strong and stable, where it is decreasing and where it is non-existent.
- 2. How do we approach each region in terms of strategies for membership. Is it the same for each region
- 3. How do we make the work RTI does, more effective?

RT Israel Holy AGM and Mass Tour

As a mass tour this was great event. It was brilliantly organized. Israel has a lot of culture and history to offer, which makes the trip fascinating. However from a tabling point of view, it highlighted the need for more WMC focus on RT Israel.

The WMC group, led by RT Sweden have put some plans in place to help RT Israel back on the growth path. We will monitor closely the progress made by RT Israel.
